Tony's Run

In the story of Phantom Lake YMCA Camp, we tell of the journey of the group of boys from the Milwaukee YMCA, who traveled roughly 30 miles to the shores of Phantom Lake.

In the spring of 2006, **Tony** Ayala, Phantom staff member, organized the first annual Strong Kids Benefit Run. In celebration of 110 years of camping, 75 years of girls camp, and 50 years of a teen leadership program. He along with a dedicated support crew, ran from Veteran's Park on Lake Michigan in Milwaukee through downtown and down National Avenue all the way to PLYC's Campfire Hill. As Tony rounded the final corner of his 30 mile journey he quickly understood the success of this event.

The run took over 5 hours. Tony asked for donations from former teachers, professors, coaches,

family, friends, Phantom Alumni and Staff. In the end he raised \$3,015 for Phantom's Strong Kids Campaign. All proceeds helped provide camper scholarships and financial support.

The Strong Kids Benefit Run had many moments Tony deemed highlights. "Everything from the Friday night spaghetti dinner and campfire, the historical Water St. bridge, beautiful downtown Milwaukee, running beside my father, to completing the event with a barbecue with many Phantom friends and my family."

Tony hopes he can assist in developing this event as a spring PLYC tradition for the Phantom community. In broadening the opportunities for giving, he hopes to transform this 30-mile run into a cooperative relay. By doing this we can allow for alumni, board representatives, current staff, SDPs, and other members of the Phantom family to participate and fund raise for the Phantom Strong Kids Campaign. The tentative date for the 2nd Annual Strong Kids Benefit Run will fall during Phantom Lake YMCA Camp's Memorial Day Work Weekend on Saturday, May 26, 2007.

60s-70s Alumni Reunion was Remarkable!


